Record night for Demarets

“Scoring Machine” might be the best way to describe Dominic Demarets these days. The striker scored six times last night versus Team Demar, as the Byki burst to a 5:0 halftime lead and then cruised to an easy 9:4 victory. The double hat trick gave Demarets 21 goals for the season, eclipsing the old mark of 19, set by George Siepiora in the first session of the 1998-99 campaign in the Odeum's Over 30 League. With seven games left in this session, there's no telling how high Demarets' goal total may climb.

The triumph got the Over 40 Team back on the winning track, placing them solidly in second place in the Sportszone's Over 30 League. The Byki will complete the cycle by playing all of their opponents two more times each and then cap off the season with a playoff match.

Coach Bernhard Kleine wanted the Byki to get off to a fast start versus Demar. In the first meeting between the sides, the match was scoreless at the break, as pesky Demar were determined to make a game of it. The Byki used their technical superiority to wear down Demar and walked away comfortable 4:0 winners that night. Kleine emphasized a pressing

style of defense in the hope of creating turnovers.

Kleine's tactics worked like a charm. The Byki were on the board in the first minute of the contest and then slapped Demar into submission with a four-goal surge in a span of 5:42 late in the first half. Demar clearly looked like a beaten team, but battled back after the break, as the Byki took their foot off the gas.

After just 0:45, Demarets went right to work. After a shot barely missed the post, Demarets chased down the weak clearance by the defense and launched a long-range bomb that gave the keeper no chance. The constant pressure on Demar's fullbacks was too much for them to handle and the Byki enjoyed a dominant edge in ball possession.

Demarets made it 2:0 with 11:18 left when he cracked a bomb of a shot from long distance. The ball hit the underside of the crossbar as it hurtled past the bewildered goalie. Just 0:47 later, the Byki were buzzing around the Demar goal again. George Gorecki had an open shot from the arc, but a defender blocked it. Demarets pounced on the loose ball and slotted home for a 3:0 lead.

With 7:18 to go, Bob Marvin fired a booming shot that careened off the boards and curled to the far side of the field. Rick Bolesta, newly promoted by Kleine to the front line, controlled the ball on the wing and sent a terrific shot over the outstretched hands of the keeper to put the Byki 4:0 to the good.

The score swelled to 5:0 with 6:30 left, as Siepiora made an incisive pass to Demarets in the middle. Demarets picked his spot, sending the ball into the corner of the goal.

The Byki had the opportunity to put Demar out of their misery in the second half, but let them off the hook. Passes started getting sloppy and the ballhawking defense toned down the pressure. Demar took advantage and broke the ice by passing the ball behind the Byki defense, giving their striker an easy chance to beat the diving Sal Farhan. “You could see that goal coming by the way we started the second

half,” commented Kleine.

The Byki made it 6:1 midway through the half when they converted a counterattack while killing a penalty. Brian Cooper initiated the play with an aggressive steal at midfield, and he and Demarets came 2 v 2. Demarets went solo and handily rounded the keeper.

After Demar cut the lead to 6:2 on a free kick, the Byki replied 1:04 later after Fleet Neighbors stole the ball near the boards at midfield. He dumped the ball to Marvin, who did the rest, notching his sixth goal of the season.

Demar made it 7:3 with 4:39 left after a shot from the wing deflected off of Rich Ahrens, sending Farhan the wrong way. The Byki needed only 0:43 to up the lead to 8:4. Kleine stole the ball and spotted the Demar goalie near the red line. Kleine quickly slid the ball to Demarets, who put the ball away after feinting the last defender out of the way. A counterattack with 1:05 left wrapped up the scoring for the Byki, as Marvin led a 3-on-1 break. With Demar players

desperately out of position, Marvin made the smart pass to Kleine, who faked the keeper to the turf and knocked the ball home.

With three players having double-figure point totals, the Over 40s are scoring goals at an unprecedented rate. If they maintain their discipline, they can give SportsZone a ruin for their money at the top of the table.

Hat trick for Haynes nets Byki win

The B Team snapped out of their doldrums last Tuesday with a resounding 7:4 victory over United. Russ Haynes scored three straight times late in the contest to snap a 4:4 deadlock. Kevin Biggs added a pair of tallies and Ryan Eliasek provided a stellar performance in the nets, making several spectacular saves.

The victory was a huge relief for the Byki, who had been searching frantically for a balanced performance at both ends of the field. Although their defense could still use a bit of tightening, the squad look like they are at least operating on the same page.

Haynes, who was also coaching the side in Joe Gambino’s absence, wanted the Byki to force the issue on United, who had just one substitute on the bench. “Many of the United players were a little chunky,” noted Haynes. “We wanted to make them chase the ball.”

United, on the other hand, came out very composed and confident. They grabbed the lead after only five minutes, thanks to slack marking by the Byki defense. The early strike served as a wake-up call for the Byki, who then got organized in the back and began to put pressure on United.

United managed to make their lone goal stand up until late in the first half. It took the Byki a while to find their groove, but they showed confidence in their game and were out to prove that they were the better team. Byki pressure led to the equalizer, as Biggs harassed the United goalie. He tried to get out of the jam by passing to a nearby defender,

but the defender foolishly tried to force the ball back. Biggs cut off the weak backpass and put the ball into the back of net.

United decided to go conservative and sent more players back on defense. The game remained tight for the remainder of the first half and the sides went in 1:1 at the break.

“Once we tired them out a little, we needed to make quick subs and finish the job,” said Haynes. The Byki wasted little time in grabbing the lead. Dan Stanley took a ball into the corner and hit it off the boards to Biggs, who slammed the ball home with a first-time shot.

The aggressive display by the Byki started getting under the skin of some of the United players, who went to the referee to complain. When the referee wouldn’t help them, vigilante justice took over, resulting in a couple of shoving matches. The referee finally did assert his authority and showed a red card to a United player. The red card proved to be costly because it left United without any substitutes for the rest of the match.

Enda McGrath received two-minute penalty for his part in the fracas, as the referee tried to even things up. “It was very commendable of Enda that he didn’t retaliate against the shoves he received from the United player,” said Haynes.

In the ensuing 4 v 4 situation, the Byki took control of things and passed the ball around the United area with confidence. Then Marek Ciszewski made it 3:1 to the Byki when he pounced on a loose ball in a goalmouth scramble

and walked the ball in using his body.

Despite having no subs on the bench, United clawed their way back into the game. Thanks to some glaring errors by the Byki defense, United scored twice to level the score, and then unexpectedly took back the lead.

Ivan Torossian got the Byki level once again, as he pressured the goalkeeper and kicked the ball between his legs as he was trying to pick it up. Despite the protests from the United players, the goal stood. After United went 5:4 up, it was Torossian evening the score, thanks to the assist from McGrath.

The back-and-forth was too much for Haynes, so he decided to take matters into his own hands. Haynes stole the ball from a United defender at the halfway line and went straight to goal, faking a defender to the ground at the edge of the box. He then finished off the play with a low shot in the corner with his trusty left peg, giving the Byki a lead they would never relinquish.

Minutes later, it was Haynes again, driving home another left-footed blast from outside the box after taking a pass from Stanley. Haynes returned to the field one more time to

complete his hat trick, receiving a pass along the boards from Moore as the Byki came forward on the counter. Haynes disposed of the last defender with ease, and then rounded the goalie to deposit the ball into the back of the net to put the result beyond any doubt.

“The team was well balanced in defense and attack,” said Haynes afterwards. “Gambino should take note: he was missing for two games, and all of a sudden, both the A and B Teams win.”

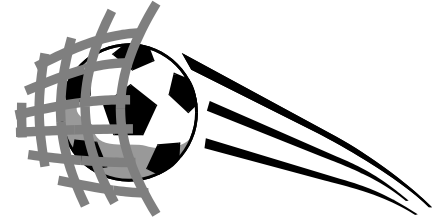

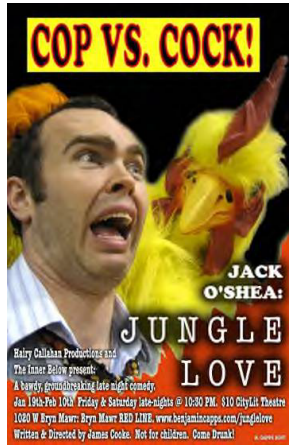


Jack O'Shea is back and he returned to the stage with a vengeance for a brief run in January and February. And wherever Jack O'Shea is found, **Russ Haynes** can't be far behind.

Jack O'Shea is the creation of former Byk **Jim Cooke**, who wrote the play, directed it, and played the lead role. *Jack O'Shea: Jungle Love* is the third installment in the Jack O'Shea series. A group of Byki and friends attended the play recently and there was no shortage of merriment. After all, who isn't entertained by hermaphrodite gorillas having cross-species sex, or by a mutant chicken who thinks it's a wrestler, or by genitalia flung across the stage? Yes, there's something there for everyone.

In the previous Jack O'Shea production, Russ played several roles, including a brawling, moronic masked wrestler, and a Cockney whore who gives birth to a gorilla. In *Jungle Love*, Russ did not reprise those classic characters, but got all serious on us by playing the weird Sid Sodoff, who managed the monkeys in the play. He also played Inspector Humphries, a bumbling Scotland-Yard-like detective with a totally outrageous English accent.

Russ stuck true to his Byki roots, wearing a red Byki jersey and a Byki scarf when he played Sid. The scarf, by the way, was courtesy of Byki Prez **George Gorecki**, who was in attendance that night. "Russ comes up to me before the play and wants to borrow my scarf," recalled George. "So I loan him the scarf, and the next thing I see is Russ wearing the scarf, Russ wrapping the scarf around the apes,



and Russ doing who knows what with my scarf backstage. When I get it back from him afterwards, it feels kind of damp, so I can just imagine what those Jack O'Shea sickos were doing with it."

At least Sodoff and Humphries are not having sex with the simians. Why gorillas are such a big focus of the Jack O'Shea series is a question left for Jim Cooke to answer. In *Jungle Love*, the apes have sex with many of the characters in the cast, none more outrageous than Dick Turdsack, the Ukrainian power broker who thinks he's in control of the apes. Turdsack nearly stole the show with his snazzily choreographed dance scene with Coco and Giganto, who are the two gorillas. The portly Turdsack tenaciously prances around the stage in his Speedo underwear, with very little left to the imagination regarding his manhood.

But in the end, it is Giganto who lives up to his name and becomes the hero who saves the

day. Turdsack is in cahoots Colombian drug lord Lalo Ortega, whose penis is ripped from his mid-section by one of the apes. It was quite hilarious to watch Ortega walking around wearing what looked like a big outer diaper with a red spot where his penis used to be. It turns out that the gorillas are not being controlled by Turdsack, but are in fact visitors from outer space. Once it is obvious that O'Shea cannot subdue this band of criminals single-handedly, Giganto steps in and uses his three-foot long penis to choke the bad guys to death. At least he got some practical uses out of a thing that long.

Steven Pedlow really seemed to like the play. "It was great to see Russ' villain character on-stage in his red game-day Stare Byki kit putting George's Byki scarf on a gorilla! I went there expecting to be shocked, and I wasn't disappointed - great fun," he said. "Best line: 'Nobody turns my wiener into dinner and gets away with it.'"

Wei Zhang turned out to be a really big fan of Jack O'Shea, as

he attended the play twice. "Good to see the Gaffer is not in the gorilla suit this time, because I don't think he could handle the strangling scene near the end," noted Wei.

Andy Lane observed, "A play about trans-sexual chimps (Shimps) can't help but amuse if not be uproarious," he said. "However, due to some lax editing, I left the theatre pondering who really got their arse screwed more; the audience or the Shimps? Judging by the bewildered look of many attendees, I'd say it's a toss up."

Conor Casey saw the play for the work of art that it was. "The genius of Jim 'The Mangler' Cooke is that he can take an hour's worth of gorilla sex, ass rape, human defilement, molestation, perversion, and good old sexual assault, and somehow manage to also fit a plot in. Which, I can honestly say was not even necessary! Quite frankly, it was a masterpiece."
