## Byki wrecking crew tramples Real

A goal explosion reverberated all over Palatine last Sunday, as the Over 30 Team put an 8:1 pounding on overmatched Real FC at Celtic Park. Three Byki players registered two goals apiece and a total of six players found their way on to the scoresheet. The rout improved the Byki to 2-1-1. Although they currently sit in the middle of the table, they have played fewer games than anyone else so far.

The squad was strengthened when the First Team match on Sunday was canceled, allowing Reggie Champagne, Marek Ciszewski and Alan Stevens to suit up for the Over 30s. Real got no such help for their roster, as they had to bring in several of their Over 40 players. The pace of the game was more than these old-timers could handle and it didn't take the Byki very long to put their stamp on the match.

The Byki needed a few minutes to work out the bounces of the Celtic Park synthetic turf, but it was "bombs away" shortly thereafter. The Byki blitzed Real to the tune of five goals in 18 minutes to effectively put the result beyond any doubt.

A Byki counterattack in the 17th minute led to a corner kick, thanks to a great hustle play by Kuba Banbor. Kristian Buur sent the corner into the middle and Paul Pinkham did the rest, zinging a sharp header past the keeper.

Six minutes later, Marek Ciszewski's pass down the right wing put Pinkham into the clear. His low cross found Lukas Chudyba, who first-timed it into the back of the net for a 2:0 lead.

Real were reeling just moments later, when Chris Hurley intercepted a pass in front Real's penalty area and laid off for Ciszewski, whose low shot clanged off of the goalpost.

The score swelled to 3:0 in the 26th minute when Hurley ran down a long Byki clearance on the left side of the Real box. The keeper came out and Hurley unselfishly squared the ball to the unmarked Chudyba, who redirected it into the empty net. "I was thinking about shooting there," said Hurley afterwards. "But there was a 99% chance that we would score if I made the pass."

Three minutes later, Ciszewski and Banbor worked a slick give-and-go on the left side and Banbor did the honors by depositing the ball just inside the far post.

Hard work and ball movement made it 5:0 in the 35th minute. Hurley chased down a ball in the deep left corner and dropped it for Banbor. He found Buur at the top of the box, eager to shoot, and he made no mistake, rifling it past the keeper.

At halftime, the Byki talked about maintaining the same level of intensity, but it appeared that they expected Real to give up at that point. Real had other ideas, and nearly broke through seven minutes into the second half. A botched clearance inside the Byki area left a Real player with an open shot from six yards. Stevens came out strongly and blocked the shot to safety. On the ensuing corner, a Real player sent an uncontested header wide of the post.

Ten minutes later, the Byki regained their composure and upped their advantage to 6:0. Champagne found Banbor on the left side and he slipped the ball to Ciszewski in the middle. Ciszewski took a couple of touches and drilled a low shot that gave the goalie no chance.

In the 76th minute, the Byki polished off a counterattack with a nice piece of finishing. Chudyba controlled the ball on the right wing and found Pinkham alone at the top of the box. Pinkham calmly drove a low shot into the back of the net.

Real spoiled Stevens' bid for a clean sheet just moments later. A Real player sent the ball high into the Byki peanly area following a throw-in. A tricky bounce gave a forward a gift opportunity from close range. Stevens blocked that shot, but was powerless to stop the rebound.

The Byki wrapped up the scoring in the 81st minute on a nice passing sequence. Banbor sent a pass deep into the left corner for Pinkham, who sent it back to Ciszewski. The striker slid the ball over to Banbor, who measured a shot from 20 yards for his second tally on the day.

The Byki demonstrated the depth of their capability versus

## Byki outlast pesky Celtics

The Over 48 Team notched their second win of their inaugural season on Wednesday when they held off the pesky St Charles Celtics 3:1. Juan Carlos Carrillo had a memorable debut for the Byki, scoring one goal and assisting on the other two. With six points from four matches, the Byki are level with Sofia BG in second place. The sides meet on Sunday, as both seek to make up ground on powerhouse Concordia, who have the full complement of nine points from three matches.

The status of the match was up in the air right up to kickoff, thanks to the officials, who had concerns about a forecast of severe weather. The Celtics manager received a strange e-mail from one of the officials assigned to the match stating that the other two arbiters were unwilling to make the trip to St Charles without a guarantee that the match would be played. This ridiculous message was relayed to PSLC President Claudio Frigo, who reiterated the obvious: the status of any match cannot be determined until everyone is at the field. One official did show up, but had to work solo, as the other two irresponsible goofs were scared of a storm that never came. Frigo promptly suspended both of the no-show referees indefinitely.

Despite a brief rain shower prior to kickoff, the conditions at the East Side Sports Complex were close to ideal for a good football match. The Byki struggled to find their attacking form in the first half, but managed to turn things around after the break to put the points in the bank. The Byki defense played stoutly and netminder Rick Bolesta came with several key interventions to thwart the Celtics. The home team will regret their poor finishing in front of goal. On the few occasions when they found space behind the Byki backline, they typically shot very high and very wide.

The Byki experienced difficulty moving the ball efficiently in the first half. The super-wide field in St Charles practically begs teams to use the wings, and the Byki rarely explored the flanks in the first half. A lot of crowding occurred in the central areas of the field and this translated into errant passes and easy giveaways to the Celtics.

Midfielder Sven Dahlquist found Dominic Demarets running into space in the Celtics penalty area in the 15th minute. Demarets had a brief opening, but was forced to shoot off-balance from his weaker foot and the keeper saved easily.

The Byki broke the deadlock in the 35th minute. Sal Farhan was shoved from behind in the channel on the left wing, giving the Byki a free kick. Carrillo stepped up, measured his angles properly, and drove the ball over the goalie's head at the far post.

At halftime, the Byki tried to solve the midfield congestion by switching their formation. Dahlquist and Paul King had formed an effective tandem as holding midfielders, but Dahlquist would be left to handle the job alone, seeing that the Celtics were launching balls over the top with great frequency. King was shifted to fullback and Farhan and Demarets became the twin strike force on top.

The Celtics, however, made their own adjustments and thought they had created an equalizer in the 54th minute. The Byki defenders were caught in scramble mode and a potential Celtic goal was nullified for offside.

A minute later, the Celtics scored a valid goal. They came on the counterattack and pushed the ball to the left side. After a series of challenges by Byki defenders, a Celtics attacker created an opening inside the box near the byline. He found an unmarked teammate, who slammed the ball home. Bolesta got a hand on the shot, but it was not enough to prevent the goal.

The Byki were unruffled by that stretch of success by the Celtics and began carving openings in the Celtics defense. Fullback Charlie Cohen capped off an excellent give-and-go sequence with a shot from distance that dinged off of the goalpost. The Celtics keeper was rooted and his only hope to prevent a goal was the upright.

The winner came in the 75th minute, thanks to hard work and hustle. Carrillo won a 50-50 ball in the midfield, 30 yards from goal. He floated an off-balance pass into open space on the right side of the area, where Jim Jacobs swooped in with a powerful run from the flank. The Celtics reacted too slowly, leaving Jacobs with an open look at goal. He snaked a shot through the keeper's legs for a 2:1 lead.

The Celtics pushed more players forward and the Byki held firm defensively, committing only a handful of players to attack. The strategy worked out perfectly, as Carrillo was the author of the clinching goal, coming two minutes from the end. He controlled the ball at midfield and threaded a delicious through pass for winger Mariusz Gorski. A Celtics defender made a late bid to close down Gorski, who shook off that challenge and bulled his way into the box. He sent a low shot to the far post that slid underneath the diving the goalkeeper to put the result to bed.

## Byki get 3 the easy way

The Byki were idled for the second consecutive Sunday on June 21, yet they still racked up three more points when the stumblebums from Assyrian FC forfeited their scheduled match. The Assyrians made a last-ditch effort on Friday night to get the match played, but were rebuffed by coach George Gorecki. The Byki have nine points from their five matches.

The Byki were supposed to take on Olympiacos Chicago on June 14, but the match was washed out due to an unplayable field at Oak Brook. Gorecki was already looking ahead to the match versus Assyrian FC, as he suspected that shenanigans would be the order of the day.

“I had noticed that the Assyrians had not scheduled any of their home matches by the league-mandated deadline in April,” said Gorecki. “I had a feeling that they would try to keep us waiting until the last minute because they are irresponsible, so I informed the NSL that we might refuse to play if we did not get at least seven days’ notice of the match details, as stated in the NSL rulebook.”

Gorecki inquired at the NSL office on Monday, and got no new information at the League’s regular meeting on Wednesday. The NSL still had not gotten word from the Assyrians about a venue or kickoff time. Gorecki demanded a timetable for calling off the match, which the League set for Thursday, at which time the Byki would win by forfeit. When Thursday came and went, Gorecki informed his players that they would have Sunday off.

“The Assyrian coach called me on Friday night to tell me that they had a field for a game,” said Gorecki. “I told him that the League had called off the match and that we were not interested in trying to assemble a team at the last minute. Other teams have played along with this garbage, but we won’t put up with it. Organizing things week-to-week is not something you do in a first-class league. We take the points and move on.”
