Byki trample hapless Adventists

The Over 30 Team earned their second gaudy result in three matches when they demolished Adventists United 12:0 last Sunday at Oak Brook. For the second time this season, the Over 30s delivered a double hat trick, with Volkan Akbas and Lukas Chudyba doing the honors. In all, eight of the eleven players in uniform found their way onto the scoresheet. The victory allows the Byki to maintain their hold on third place in the standings.

It was the second trouncing of Adventists this season, as the Byki won 8:0 to open the campaign. Adventists have conceded double digit goal totals nine times in twelve matches, with the worst coming in at 18 goals. One has to hand it to a team that absorbs such heavy defeats and yet keeps coming back for more soccer the next Sunday.

The Byki needed just five minutes to open their account. Richard Sodeinde carried along the left wing and crossed the ball to the right wing for Carlos Jaramillo. The midfielder found a wide-open Akbas in the box, and he knocked the ball home for a 1:0 lead.

A few minutes later, Rodrigo Espinoza controlled the ball near the right-wing corner flag and played it into the box. An Adventists defender stuck his foot out to block the cross, but redirected it into his own goal.

Sodeinde made it 3:0 at the half hour mark, as he dribbled 30 yards and went directly to goal. With no one challenging him, he promptly deposited the ball into the net for his eighth goal of the season.

Right before the halftime whistle, Espinoza skated past a few defenders and finished the play with a great pass into the box for Akbas to put home.

The outcome was foregone conclusion by this time and the only question left would be the final tally. To their credit, the Byki kept playing smart soccer and maintained a standard to keep the ball moving. Three minutes into the second stanza, Paul Gibbs played a great ball into the box from the right flank and Chudyba tapped home for his first tally of the season.

The score swelled to 6:0 when Chase Castle dribbled the ball towards the Adventists penalty and seeing no defenders nearby, chose to fire away. His blast found the back of the net in the 53rd minute.

The Gibbs-Chudyba collaboration reconvened six minutes later. Gibbs played a great pass from half field into open space to spring Chudyba on a breakaway. The goalkeeper came out to challenge, but Chudyba easily got past him to make it 7:0.

Jaramillo and Akbas beat a group of Adventists defenders with an excellent combination play in the 63rd minute. Akbas played provider for Jaramillo, who bagged his third goal in two matches.

The Byki made it 9:0 after converting a corner kick opportunity. Castle took most of the corners on the day and consistently played some great balls into the box. On this occasion, he swung a cross towards the goalie, who did his best to punch it away. The ball fell fortuitously right to Sodeinde and he simply crushed a shot into the upper 90.

Gibbs recorded a hat trick of assists, finding his favorite target Chudyba, in the 72nd minute. The pair were productive enough that they likely could have doubled their goal output.

Castle served up another great corner in the 77th minute. The ball beat everyone, leaving an unmarked Reggie Champagne to tap in at the far post to make it 11:0.

Akbas completed his hat trick on the game's final goal. Jaramillo laid off a simple square pass for Akbas, who dribbled past two defenders and slipped the ball under the

The history between the Byki and NSL powerhouse RWB Adria is a brief one, limited to five matches played between the sides during the four seasons when the Byki competed in the Major Division from 2010 to 2013. The results were not pretty, all losses, by a combined score of 5:31. The 2018 edition of the Byki First Team fared a bit better when the rivalry was renewed last Sunday. Adria won the game 4:2, but the Byki could clearly see that the difference in quality between the teams was not the wide chasm that it once was.

That difference was found in two key areas: overall team speed and accuracy of finishing. Adria's attacking players consistently outpaced the back six for the Byki and created several scoring opportunities in the Byki penalty area. And Adria, like any elite team, were ruthless in their finishing. The Byki created their own chances as well, but their marksmanship was below the standard set by Adria, and this was reflected in the final score.

Knowing what they were up against, the Byki set out to maintain good defensive shape in the early going and then see where their own attacking ideas might lead them. The players executed the tactics well enough to limit Adria just one good look at goal in the early moments of the contest. Goalkeeper Ray Najera came up with a key block to bail out his teammates in the ninth minute.

The Byki got their first shot on frame in the 20th minute. Francesco de Felice carried the ball to the byline and laid

a diagonal pass back to the left corner of the box for Andy Sokolowski. His knuckling shot forced the keeper to punch the ball clear.

Three minutes later, Adria sent a ball over the top of the Byki defense that landed in the penalty area. The Adria player had only Najera to beat and slotted home for a 1:0 lead

Adria looked set to double their advantage in the 28th minute when the Byki committed a costly turnover in their back third. As the Adria player raced in alone, Alan Stevens timed his slide tackle perfectly to clear away the danger.

The Byki responded in the 31st minute. Stevens launched one of his specialty deep throw-ins from the right flank and found Phil Parker in the mixer. Parker outjumped his marker and floated a header just inside the post to make it 1:1.

Stevens caused further mayhem in the Adria penalty area four minutes later with another long throw-in. Erik Yamane teed up his blast, saved by a desperate block by an Adria defender.

Two goals just before halftime gave Adria a needed lift. The Byki defense were beaten for speed on both occasions and Adria players converted the straightforward opportunities.

Things got interesting at the start of the second half. De Felice and Arinze Okafor double-teamed an Adria defender who tried to play the ball out of the back. Okafor came out of the fray and sprinted to goal. His final touch looked a bit too big, but he and the keeper arrived at the ball at about the same time. After the collision, the keeper could not grab hold of the ball and a final poke from Okafor brought the Byki back at 3:2.

The Byki kept up the chase for an equalizer. In the 53rd minute, an Adria defender blocked Mark Zeman's shot at the top of the box. Parker gained control and sent Yamane clear into the Adria penalty area. The keeper charged off his line and forced Yamane to shoot wide.

Adria got back to a comfortable two-goal margin with 15 minutes to go. They beat the Byki on the counter yet again, finishing with a well-placed shot from the right side of the area.

In January, the Byki faced serious questions about their ability to compete at the Major Division level. Although wins have been hard to come by, the Byki have a clear view of where improvements are needed.

Late goals kill Byki

Goals in the final 15 minutes propelled Olympiacos Chicago to a narrow 2:1 victory over the Byki in Over 40 play last Sunday at Oak Brook. It was another frustrating loss for the Byki, who have amassed just nine points in ten matches of this hard-luck season. Olympiacos are at the other end of the table, having two draws as the only blemishes on their undefeated record after 11 matches.

Midfielder Diego Penafiel was buzzing around the Olympiacos goal in the opening stages of the contest. In the ninth minute, his corner kick wound up with the supporting Dave Safford at the far end of the Olympiacos penalty area. Safford played the ball to Andy Lane, who in turn found Penafiel, whose cross Steven Pedlow headed over the crossbar.

The Olympiacos keeper did well six minutes later, when he punched Penafiel's tricky shot out of danger.

Penafiel, however, finally found the mark in the 17th minute, when he stole the ball from an Olympiacos player and slotted home his team-leading fourth goal of the season.

The visitors came close just after the half hour, when a ball driven towards goal glanced off of the post. The play was wiped out when the assistant signaled for offside.

John Park, utilized as an emergency goalkeeper, forced an Olympiacos player to shoot wide of the target as he came in on a breakaway chance in the 37th minute.

The one-goal lead for the Byki looked set to stand up until Olympiacos snagged an apparent equalizer in the 61st minute. Another offside scenario negated the danger from that opportunity.

Olympiacos finally leveled the score with a valid goal in the 75th minute. An Olympiacos player launched a long ball towards the Byki goal from the touchline right around the midfield stripe. It was truly a wonder strike, catching Park off of his line.

Olympiacos found their winning goal 11 minutes later, as a player raced past the last line of defense and then knocked the ball past Park.
