Byki full of blunders

After a stunning ten-goal outburst versus FC Kosova, the Byki landed with a thud last Friday when they dropped a 4:1 decision Chicago Dynasty FC in disappointing fashion. After grabbing an early lead, the Byki were unable to hold off a scrappy Dynasty side that fought harder for the 50-50 balls. The Byki stand at 1-0-2 for the season.

The Byki tried to put their stamp on the match from the outset and high pressure left the Dynasty defenders in disarray. Todd Trowbridge pressured a Dynasty player, who coughed up possession rather easily and Daniel Zielinski swooped in to clean things up. With the Dynasty goalie out of his box, but too far away to get involved, Zielinski slid the ball into the empty net.

If that early strike was an indication that the rest of the match was going to be that easy, the Byki certainly got too comfortable. They created two more good chances in the first half and their failure to convert would prove costly.

With 3:59 gone, Alen Mehagic laid off a square ball to Ohad Garnon, who made a late supporting run out of the back. Garnon fired a first-time shot that the keeper snared. Ten minutes later, Robert Redepenning sent a long ball for Otto Rodriguez, who beat his man, but could not beat the keeper, whose kick save kept Dynasty in the game.

Just 0:35 later, Alex Guzman got caught in possession near the boards and a booming shot from the right wing just found the far post to make it 1:1.

The teams played in see-saw fashion during the middle portion of the match. The Byki were unable to maintain possession effectively and excessive dribbling was a costly tactic.

Dynasty broke the logjam with 10:22 left in the contest. After goalkeeper Amit Khankari punched a long shot high in the air, the loose ball rattled around until a Dynasty player fired from distance, catching the underside of the crossbar. The referee ruled that the ball had crossed the line and Dynasty didn't need to look back.

Poor defending by the Byki allowed Dynasty to go up by two with 6:30 to go. A Dynasty player sneaked the ball out of a double-team at midfield and then ran across the field into space along the right flank to receive a return pass. A shot from the deep corner found the back of the net, sinking Byki fortunes. Dynasty put a wrap on things with 2:00 left and exited the Odeum with three well-earned points.

Tatry show Byki who's boss

The Over 35 Team squandered what was likely their final opportunity to catch league leaders Tatry FC when Tatry delivered a crushing 7:2 defeat in Week 7 of the Miro Indoor Soccer League. The Byki trail Tatry by six points with just two games left.

The teams first squared off in early November. Tatry won that game 7:6, but the contest was competitive throughout. Tatry were full prepared in the rematch and played like a team ready to be crowned champions.

Both teams came out to play with high energy at the beginning of the game. The Byki showed patience and tried to work the ball forward. Their early scoring attempts were thwarted ably by the Tatry keeper.

Tatry broke into the lead at the 5:10 mark when a forward put a move past a Byki defender and toe-poked a shot inside the left post, out of the reach of Byki netminder James Vlahakis.

A few minutes later, Mark Weslar faked a pass to Eric Muehlbauer at the top corner of the box, drawing out the Tatry keeper. Weslar lofted a high shot to the left corner from about ten yards out to even things at 1:1.

Sensing a shift in momentum, the Byki tried to seize the advantage. Marek Ciszewski tried a nifty move in the middle and the keeper made a nice save on a high shot. Moments later, Weslar sent a pass to Paul Daly on left side, forcing the keeper into another difficult save.

Tatry went ahead for good with two quick strikes. One-on-one defense failed the Byki on both occasions and

Vlahakis was powerless to repel shots from close range.

With 16:40 left in the match, Tatry plowed through the middle of the Byki defense again to go up 4:1. At that point, the Byki became the chasers and game was changed completely. The inability to convert early chances into goals haunted the Byki. Scoring early could have made it a different game.

The Tatry lead swelled to 5:1 with 14:10 to go. A deflected ball resulted in two Tatry players unmarked in the box and Vlahakis with no help. The Byki began losing their composure and poor marking was the result.

With 11:45 to go, the Byki pulled one back when Dan Jedrzejowski took the ball down the far side and tap danced through two defenders along the touchline. As he approached the box, he lured the keeper out and slid a deft pass to a wide-open Daly for the simple tap-in to make it 5:2.

Tatry engineered the best goal of the game 2:13 later. A Tatry player came across the middle and used the outside of his right foot while going away from the goal to send the ball home to put Tatry in command at 6:2. Tatry completed the scoring with 0:10 to when a wicked corner kick deflected off of several players and trickled into the net.

Tatry are obviously an excellent technical team, and once the Byki started chasing them, Tatry found the gaps and capitalized. An exasperated Ciszewski reminded his teammates in strong terms afterwards about the importance of better marking and defensive discipline.
